Discussion Question Guidelines

- 1. What is the Background Story (the pertinent events that took place before the beginning of the play)?
- 2. What is the style of the play? What did you think the play was about?
- 3. Did you enjoy the play? Why? Why not?
- 4. What about the plot? Did it pull you in; or did you have to force yourself to read the play?
- 5. How realistic was the characterization? Would you want to meet any of the characters? Did you like them? Hate them?
- 6. How would you describe the physiological (movements), sociological (status) and psychological (mental state) aspects of the characters? Did the actions of the characters seem plausible? Why? Why not?
- 7. What are the Given Circumstances (the important information gleaned from the dialogue, stage directions and characters actions in the play)?
- 8. What was the dialogue of the characters? Was it appropriate? Did it enhance the story? Did any speeches/monologues occur? Did they have high stakes?
- 9. How does the setting figure into the play?
- 10. How would the play have been different if it had taken place in a different time or place?
- 11. If one (or more) of the characters made a choice that had moral implications, would you have made the same decision? Why? Why not?
- 12. What are some of the play's themes? How important were they?
- 13. How are the play's images symbolically significant? Do the images help to develop the plot, or help to define characters?
- 14. How important or detailed were the Stage Directions?
- 15. Did the play end the way you expected? Did you feel that the play fulfilled your expectations?
- 16. Would you recommend this play to other readers? To your close friend?
